1 General aspects of the agreement

- 1.1 What is your opinion on the agreement in general? Is the agreement in line with usual professional practice? Are there essential faults? Would you suggest improving certain aspects? Are there any points missing?
- 1.2 Payment Terms: Are procedures and taxes mentioned in Section 4 of the agreement commonly used in such agreements? Do you see any problems in (or advantages to) relying on a subscription agent for the payment procedure? Is it relevant and okay that interest charges are mentioned in this paragraph? Would you suggest any improvements? (A 4)
- 1.3 Confidentiality: Is this clause commonly accepted or should the Swiss Consortium insist on the removal of this clause? Has this claused often been removed in your experience? (A 7.8)

2 Subscriber / Subscribing institutions

- 2.1 Currently, the ETH Domain is considered to be three subscribers by Elsevier (1. ETH Zürich, 2. EPF Lausanne,
- 3. Lib4RI -Library for the Research Institutes within the ETH Domain: Eawag, Empa, PSI & WSL. For reference concerning the ETH Domain see http://www.ethrat.ch/en/node/595). Would you consider it possible to merge these three subscribers into one subscriber only (although the institutions itself will not change)? Would you expect financial benefits for the subscribers with such a merger? (Sch 2)
- 2.2 Can we expect Elsevier to write an unlimited cancellation allowance into the contract in case of a merger of (any) libraries.
- 2.3 If there is a multi-year consortial agreement, have you seen any contracts in which individual participants may leave this contract? Can we expect Elsevier to write such a clause into the contract? Are there necessary conditions for this, such as budgetary problems? Should we expect an impact on the whole consortium or on the participants? (A 5.3)

3 Subject of the agreement
